You have to be at the top of your class to go on exchange. False! Rotary Youth Exchange is open to all qualified young people ages 15 to 18. You don't need to be a straight-A student, but you do need to be doing well in school, and have a clean disciplinary record. Generally, a solid B student is a perfect fit for exchange—it's all about having the flexibility to go with the flow because there are a lot of new things to learn!

A whole school year is forever. False. Ten months go by in the blink of an eye! With all the new people, places, and things to discover—from the language to the food to even everyday stuff like riding the bus or counting change—time flies. It's like we say, "A year in a life; a life in a year."

I won't get along with my host family. False. Not everyone clicks instantly, but with Rotary, you actually live with two to three different volunteer host families during your year. This gives you a real taste of the culture and a support network to fall back on. And remember, these families volunteer because they genuinely want to open their hearts and homes to exchange students like you. Plus, there's a caring Rotary counselor in every location ready to help with anything big or small.

Youth Exchange is super expensive. False. Costs do vary based on your destination, but compared to other programs, Rotary Youth Exchange is affordable. For the 2025-26 exchange year, it's around \$6,500, which covers almost everything. And if you need financial help, Rotary's got options—no exceptional student has ever missed out due to finances.

Rotary is a non-profit, all-volunteer program. Rotary does not make money on Youth Exchange and does not pay families to host. Other exchange programs cost \$20,000-\$25,000! Rotary even provides exchange students with a monthly stipend of \$75-\$100, just to help out (which is not part of the program fees).



I might not graduate on time. False. The vast majority of exchange students graduate on time with their original class. And the courses you take abroad will usually count toward graduation in California public schools, so you'll be back on track when you return.

I'll never learn the language. False. Learning a new language isn't easy, but with dedication, most exchange students are conversational by January and well on their way to being fluent by the end of their exchange year. There's no better way to learn than being surrounded by the new language every day!

I'll miss out on my favorite activities. False. Whether it's basketball, jazz band, robotics, theater or dance, you can find clubs and teams all over the world. If your favorite activity isn't there, it's the perfect time to try something new, like rugby instead of American football. And having shared interests is one of the best ways to make new friends and practice a new language.

Leaving after the year will be tough. **True.** When it's time to go, saying goodbye to friends, host families, and places you've grown to love won't be easy. But looking back on all the experiences, friendships, and challenges overcome, you'll realize this was one of the most rewarding things you've ever done. You'll come back as more of who you are, with memories that will last a lifetime. You'll always be able to say, "I did that. I really did."

Be a Host Hero!

As part of the Rotary Youth Exchange, each student accepted into the program needs three host families to support another inbound student, creating a true 1:1 exchange. Your commitment as a host family helps ensure that your own child, as an outbound student, will be welcomed abroad by other families. To facilitate the hosting process, Rotary provides all prospective families with a full orientation, including a criminal background check, home inspection, and training. The initial commitment is for three to five months, during which your family will receive the full support of Rotary counselors trained to address any needs, large or small.

Rotary Youth Exchange takes youth protection and support very seriously. Each exchange student is backed by a team fluent in multiple languages and skilled in international student support. In addition, a rapid response team of therapists, law enforcement, youth protection experts, and State Department specialists is always ready to assist in any unexpected event.

By opening your home, you offer not just a place to stay but an experience of belonging and growth—one that has a lasting impact on your family, your student, and the world.
